

The Commission viewed the proposed site for the water reservoir and discussed the proposal with the CVRD staff. It noted that the area of the reservoir site had been cleared, and that the reservoir would be approximately 6 meters high and 12 meters in diameter. The CVRD staff explained that the water reservoir was a required upgrade of services to the area as there is no room to expand the existing reservoir in its current location.

Context

The proposal was weighed against the purposes of the Commission as stipulated in section 6 of the *Agricultural Land Commission Act* (the "Act"). They are:

- 1. to preserve agricultural land
- 2. to encourage farming on agricultural land in collaboration with other communities of interest, and
- 3. to encourage local governments, first nations, the government and its agents to enable and accommodate farm use of agricultural land and uses compatible with agriculture in their plans, bylaws and policies.

Discussion

The Commission assessed the impact of the proposal against the long term goal of preserving agricultural land. The Commission noted that the area proposed for the installation of the water reservoir was a small area and was within a community park. As such, the Commission did not believe the proposal would negatively impact the existing or potential agricultural use of the property or surrounding lands.

Conclusion

That the proposal will not negatively impact agriculture.
