PROPOSAL: The proposal is to expand the current composting activities to include a compost facility

capable of processing up to 40,000 tonnes per year. This facility will be able to receive

and process agricultural waste, yard waste and some food waste. It will allow

continued production of value-added soil and fertilizer products from agricultural waste.

In addition to the buildings already on site, the applicant proposes to construct one 60 ft wide by 150 ft long screening and storage building, one 60 ft by 60 ft receiving building, and 10 gutter connected 30 ft by 200 ft shelters for covered window composting. The buildings and covered windows will be located on a 450 by 450 ft asphalt surface

behind the hog barns.

PROPOSAL INFORMATION

Background: There was a previous application in February 2007 on the subject property to

create a compost facility to process the liquid hog manure produced on the farm and to export composted material. At the time of this application the property

was used as a 300 sow farrow to finish hog farm.

According to the applicant, the farm would be more financially viable, if it could accept manure from other farms, combine it with the liquid hog manure through the system developed by Transform Compost Systems Ltd to create an organic fertilizer to market. The Commission was satisfied that the application would

improve the waste management issues in the general area.

The Commission supported the previous application in 2007 to compost hog manure produced on the farm and to import horse and poultry manure and greenhouse sawdust waste to aid in the composting process. The hog farm is no longer operational and the proponent wishes to utilize existing buildings in association with the proposed stuctures for the composting operation.

The Abbotsford Agricultural Advisory Committee (AAC) recommended that the application be suported as presented, as it has the potential to benefit local agriculture and sustainability by establishing a facility that will assist in addressing the problematic issue of agricultural/domestic organic waste disposal.
