

Exclusion – Post a Sign

If you are applying to exclude land from the ALR, you are required to provide notice of your application to the public. (See Sections 15 & 16 of the Agricultural Land Reserve Use, Subdivision and Procedure Regulation.)

As the applicant, you are responsible for ensuring the notice requirements are fulfilled prior to submitting your application to the local government and for all costs arising from providing the notice. The following information outlines how to post a sign on the land for an exclusion application.

Post a sign on the land.

- The purpose of the sign is to identify the property so that any person reading the notice in the newspaper or any person served a notice of your application can confirm the location.
- The sign must display enlarged copies of the notice and the application covering a minimum area of 60 cm x 120 cm. While the Commission does not require applicants to have signs professionally made it does expect that the lettering on the sign is large enough to be seen from the road. It also expects the sign to be weather proofed. We strongly suggest that the further away the property is the larger the sign.
- The wording of the notice is to be the same as the newspaper advertisement notice.
- The sign must be placed at the midpoint of the property along a public road so that it is visible from the road and so that vegetation does not hide it from view.
- You may wish to include a **map showing the area proposed for exclusion** on the sign if more than one property is involved or if you are only proposing to exclude a portion of your property to avoid confusion.
- The sign should stay up until application decision.

If the sign location is impractical please contact the ALC pursuant to Sections 16(3) of the Agricultural Land Reserve Use, Subdivision and Procedure Regulation.
